## City to celebrate silver anniversary of ADA

Cincinnati will be celebrating the 25th anniversary of the world's first comprehensive civil rights law protecting people with disabilities, the Americans with Disabilities Act, on July 27 in Downtown Cincinnati.

The public is invited to join the celebration, first a march from City Hall to Fountain Square, then a party on Fountain Square with speakers, awards, entertainers and exhibitors.

The inaugural Disability Pride

March will leave City Hall at 9:30 a.m. and follow a six-block route on the sidewalks. The Fountain Square festivities will be held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

"The ADA anniversary is a time when we can reflect positively on a law that has made a great impact on the lives of people with disabilities, our city and our nation," said Kat Lyons, co-chair of the 25th Anniversary Planning Committee.

Awards will be presented to individuals and organizations that have supported full inclusion and participation for people with disabilities.

The winners of a writing contest also will be honored for expressing how the ADA has impacted them or someone they know.

Entertainment will be provided by two area groups: Steel 'n Jon, an acoustic duo, and Melodic Connections, which provides music therapy to people with learning disabilities.
